




Training course in visual anthropology for PhD-students by Karl Kaser (Graz) and Mariyana Piskova (Blagoevgrad)

The training course for PhD-students aims at presenting the role of films in the cultural and scientific exchange and interaction between Europe and the countries of the Black Sea region from the early years of cinema to the time after the First World War. The task of the course is to encourage the students to take part in the discussions about the significance of the researches on the visual anthropology in the Black Sea region.

In Western Europe, cinema emerged under conditions of increased technical-industrial development and urbanization and quickly turned into a means of visual mass communication and international cultural exchange. At the beginning, the Black Sea countries were hardly touched by these developments because the mentioned infrastructure was missing. Only the larger cities were involved into the emerging cinema business. In the interwar period this situation changed for the South Caucsasian countries because the authorities of the Soviet Union realized the potential of the cinema for influencing the mass of population. The Soviet Union started to invest massively in film production and cinema infractracture since about 1930. In the socialist Balkan countries this was only the case since around 1950.

Various cultural traditions, generational and gender relations, for instance, were projected in the process of creation and reception of movies. This is reflected by the language of films, and by mutual interactions in the knowledge exchange of film professionals – directors, operators, actors, painters, composers, musicians.
